Do make and Ordain this to be my Last Will and Testament, Principally and first of all, I give my Soul into the hand of Almighty God that gave it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors herein after mentioned. — And as touching such worldly Estate, as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner: to wit, First of all, I Order and allow my funeral Expenses and Just Debts, to be first paid and Satisfied out of the whole of my Estate. — 2^d I give and bequeath unto Mary Elizabeth my beloved Wife my house and Lot in the Town of Sunbury, with all the household and Kitchen furniture as it stands at my Decese, and with all the Improvements thereon Erected, together also with all my right and Improvement on a tract of Land on Shamoken Creek, and also all my Estate both Real and personal, where it may be found, in as full and ample a manner as I my self had and held the same, unto her my beloved Wife her heirs and Assigns for ever. — 3^d I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth, one Cow, to the value of four pounds one further Pound, to the value of six pounds ten Shillings, and also the sum of five Shillings in full of her Right of all my Estate both Real and personal, to her, and her heirs and Assigns for ever. — Lastly, I do hereby constitute make and Ordain Mary Elizabeth my beloved wife Executrix, and William Dewart Executor of this my last Will and Testament, and also do hereby utterly disallow Revoke and disannul all and every other former Wills and Testaments by me in any ways made; Ratifying and Confirming this and no other, to be my last Will and Testament, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this fifteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety one, o. Marc Pontius ^(S) Signed Sealed pronounced & Declared by the said Marcus Pontius as and for his last Will and Testament In the presence of us whose names are under Written, William M. Adam, Zachariah Robins, Robert Biggar, o. Northumberland County Is. Before me the Subscriber Register for the County afores^d On the 10th day of October in^d Dom^o 1791. Personally came William M. Adam and Robert Biggar two of the Subscribing Witnesses to the foregoing Will or Instrument of Writing and made Oath agreeable to Law, that they saw Marcus Pontius subscribe with his own hand his name to the same, and heard him publish and declare it to be his Last Will and Testament and that they together with Zachariah Robins subscribed their names as Witnesses, to the same, that this happened in the Sickness of the said, Marcus Pontius

and they verily believe he was at the time of so doing of sound and disposing mind and Memory. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand the day and year aforesaid. J. Simpson Reg.
